

Faculty position description (2021)

The Section of Medicine-Pediatrics (Dept of Pediatrics) of the Alpert Medical School of Brown University is recruiting a clinician-educator faculty member to start July, 2021.

Responsibilities will include a mix of direct ambulatory patient care and resident precepting in the Medicine-Pediatrics Primary Care Center. This shared attending-resident model practice provides preventive, urgent and chronic care for a diverse patient base and is the primary continuity training site for the program's 16 residents. We are a Level III NCQA patient-centered medical home and work as a collaborative team of professionals providing high quality care for a diverse patient population, supported by on-site behavioral health (psychology and social work), a certified diabetic educator, a licensed pharmacist, and interpreter services.

The successful candidate would possess strong clinical skills and be highly committed to teaching and providing patient-centered care to a diverse patient population. Qualified candidates must be BE/BC in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics, and possess or be eligible for a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine in Rhode Island. There are opportunities to incorporate inpatient care, QI and administrative roles, and participate in divisional/departmental collaborative research. All section faculty are considered core faculty of our residency program and participate actively in resident education, advising and recruitment.

The selected candidate will receive a faculty appointment in the Departments of Pediatrics and Medicine at an academic level commensurate with experience and qualifications. The Departments of Pediatrics and Medicine and the Alpert Medical School of Brown University offer extensive opportunities in ongoing faculty development, including certificate programs focused on clinician-educators.

Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled. Brown University and its affiliated teaching hospitals are equal opportunity (EEO/AA) employers and are committed to increasing the diversity of its faculty.
